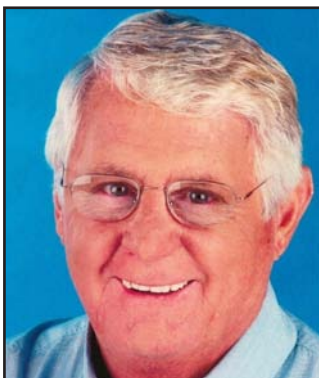

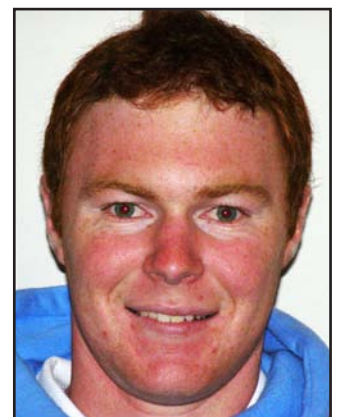

Another successful season for Killcare SLSC, with no lives lost and no major incidents. General Account (expenditure)

SLSA Insurance \$7231 (+ 1541) – Surf Life Saving Central Coast \$1446 - 259 Membership capitation fees, Surf Life Saving NSW \$3620 – Public liability membership levy. Membership is based on the previous year's membership.

Trophies \$9,373 (-\$655) – Includes the cost of the Presentation Night \$5959 (2005/06 season), as well as Nipper trophies \$2943 (current year).

Carnival expenses \$1156 (-\$1355) – Senior Carnivals \$1041

Clothing/uniforms \$1277 (-\$2967) – Purchase of Age Manager's shirts \$347, lycra competition hats \$249 which are sold predominantly to Nippers, male costumes \$680 which are sold to members and public.

Computers and Website \$227 – Monies raised at Australia Day Flag Raising was authorised to set up website by Internet Strategic Pty Ltd. They have waived the majority of their fee.

First Aid \$1,100 – Killcare Heights Garden Club donated \$750 toward the purchase of a portable First Aid Kit.

Equipment Repairs \$1573 (+ \$478) – Repairs to boards \$620, reconditioned exhaust fan for kiosk \$540, broken surf club window \$325.

Travel, Accommodation & M/V \$3603 (- \$3684) – Rookies road trip \$750, distribution of 2005 Bowls Day funds to 8 competitors \$1700, Junior Development Camp \$240, State Representative team for B Johnson \$363. Australian Titles accommodation in Western Australia \$875.

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

Scope

The financial report comprises the Summary of Balances and Income and expenditure statements for the General and Fundraising Bank Accounts of the Killcare Surf Lifesaving Club Inc for the year ended 30 April 2007. The Committee of Killcare Surf Lifesaving Club Inc is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial report. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

Audit Approach

We have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion to the members. Our audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. The nature of an audit is influenced by factors such as the use of professional judgement, selective testing, the inherent limitations of internal control and the availability of persuasive rather than conclusive evidence. Therefore, an audit cannot guarantee that all material misstatements have been detected.

We performed procedures to assess whether in all material aspects the financial report presents fairly in accordance with the Accounting Standards in Australia and the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and other mandatory financial reporting requirements in Australia.

We formed our audit opinion on the basis of these procedures which included:

- Examining on a test basis, information to provide evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report and
- Assessing the appropriateness of the accounting policies and disclosures used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates.

While we considered the effectiveness of the club's internal controls over the financial reporting when determining the nature and extent of our procedures, our audit was not designed to provide assurance on the internal controls.

Independence

In conducting our audit we followed applicable independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

Audit Opinion

In our opinion, the financial report of Killcare Surf Lifesaving Club Inc presents a true and fair view in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirement in Australia, the financial position of Killcare Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. as at 30 April 2007 and the results of its operations and cash flows for the year then ended.
