CONSTITUTION

N McMaster spoke on each clause that was seeking amendment. At the Killcare Surf Life Saving Club Management Committee Meeting of 2nd July, 2009, it was resolved unanimously to submit the following proposed Constitution amendments for consideration by the members at the club's 2009 Annual General Meeting. The proposed amendments relate to membership status and reflect current trends in lifesaving memberships and changes to club facilities afforded to members within the new clubhouse.

Replace existing Clause 6.

GENERAL

- a) Membership categories of special privilege need not be granted as a matter of members rights, but when granted, will be in recognition of years of satisfactory service.
- b) In times of National Conflict, member's service in the Australian Armed Forces may be credited to Active, Active Reserve or Long Service Membership Categories.
- c) Recognition of service to other clubs within the S.L.S.A. of Australia, shall be in accordance with the Killcare S.L.S.C. Membership classification.

with

6. GENERAL

- a. Membership categories of special privilege need not be granted as a matter of members rights, but when granted, will be in recognition of years of satisfactory service.
- b. In times of National Conflict, member's service in the Australian Armed Forces may be credited to Active, Active Reserve or Long Service Membership Categories.
- c. Recognition of service to other clubs within the S.L.S.A. of Australia, in accordance with the Killcare S.L.S.C. Membership classification, shall be at the discretion of the Management Committee.

BUSINESS ARISING:

A CAMERON MADE THE FOLLOWING COMMENTS:

- Issue relating to the last AGM where it was alleged that P Bagnall made a direct comment to A Cameron. President Macfadyen stated that he did not hear the outburst. It was advised that a complaint could be lodged against a member and the matter would be dealt with by the incoming committee.
- That there has not been sufficient time for the members to read the Annual Report and be able to comment on. Noted.
- Minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting were to be held over to the next committee meeting and adopted as agreed at last year's AGM. President Macfadyen confirmed that this was carried out.

APPLICATION FOR LIFE MEMBERSHIP – KAREN BURKE

The application was presented to the committee at the meeting held 2 July, 2009 and was voted unanimously to proceed. J Macfadyen outlined K Burke's achievements.

COMMENTS:

A Cameron: Requested that the changes to membership categories must concur with SLSA and that there is not any conflict and it is relevant to Killcare SLSC. ACTION: Seek Branch confirmation of same and if they have any issues with the proposed changes.

Replace existing Clause 12.

12. LONG SERVICE MEMBERSHIP

Long Service membership may be granted by the management committee to members who have completed twelve (12) years of active service or have completed 10 years active and four (4) years active reserve service.

- a) Granting of Long Service membership shall be by the resolution of the management Committee and members must apply in writing on the Club approved application form a minimum of fourteen (14) days prior to the club Annual General Meeting.
- b) Long Service membership shall be exempt from all patrol obligations and they have the privileges of an active member.

Not withstanding (a) above Long Service membership may be granted under exceptional circumstances to an active or active reserve member irrespective of the number of years served as an active member

with

12. LONG SERVICE MEMBERSHIP

Long Service membership may be granted by the management committee to members who have completed twelve (12) years of active service at Killcare Surf Life Saving Club or have completed 10 years active service at Killcare Surf Life Saving Club and four (4) years active reserve service.

- a) Granting of Long Service membership shall be by the resolution of the management Committee and members must apply in writing on the Club approved application form a minimum of fourteen (14) days prior to the club Annual General Meeting.
- b) Long Service membership shall be exempt from all patrol obligations and they have the privileges of an active member. Not withstanding (a) above Long Service membership may be granted under exceptional circumstances to an active or active reserve member irrespective of the number of years served as an active member

COMMENTS:

A Cameron: Spoke strongly against the fact that the service is only at Killcare SLSC.

J Bourne: Against amendment as people moved to the area 10-12 years ago may have been members at other clubs but helped the club get going again. There is a total conflict.

B Green: All clubs take membership from other clubs.

H Egger: Could there be a compromise that maybe only 5 years are necessary to be served at Killcare SLSC.

K Burke: The club has had members that have contributed little to Killcare SLSC but have asked for Long Service membership.

OUTCOME OF VOTE – MOTION LOST.

Replace existing Clause 13

13. ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP

- a) Associate membership may be granted by the management committee to persons who may or may not be the holder of S.L.S.A. awards.
- b) Associate members shall not be called upon to perform active duties.
- c) Associate members may use the club premises and facilities as approved by the management committee.
- d) No Associate member may vote at any Management Committee or General Meeting unless they have completed a minimum of five (5) years active membership service or hold a management committee position.

with

13. ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP

- a) Associate membership may be granted by the management committee to persons who may or may not be the holder of S.L.S.A. awards.
- b) Applicants for admission as Associate members must be a parent or guardian of at least one child enrolled in Junior Activities.
- c) Associate members shall not be called upon to perform active duties.
- d) Associate members may use the club premises and facilities as approved by the management committee.

AGM 2009

- e)** No Associate member may vote at any Management Committee or General Meeting unless they have completed a minimum of five (5) years active membership service or hold a management committee position.

OUTCOME OF VOTE – ACCEPT AMENDMENTS

14. LIFE MEMBERSHIP

- a)** Life Membership may be elected at the Annual General meeting by ballot, which must be carried by a four-fifths majority of the vote cast by those present and entitled to vote, provided the nominees are members of this club who have rendered special service as such over a period of fifteen (15) years and whose nominations have been endorsed by a four-fifths majority of the votes cast by those present and entitled to vote at a management committee meeting. Voting at the Annual General Meeting and management committee meeting shall be by secret ballot.
- b)** The member being nominated should have carried out some service as a member of the Club management committee.
- c)** Nominations for Life Membership shall be in writing and signed by the nominees. Two members of the club who have served fifteen (15) years satisfactory service with this club. Nomination to be submitted to a management committee of which fourteen (14) days notice has been given and if so endorsed to be submitted to the next Annual General Meeting.
- d)** The nominees may speak for the nomination at both the management committee meeting and the Annual General Meeting.

14. LIFE MEMBERSHIP

- a)** Life Membership may be elected at the Annual General meeting by ballot, which must be carried by a four-fifths majority of the vote cast by those present and entitled to vote, provided the nominees are members of this club who have rendered special service as such to Killcare Surf Life Saving Club over a period of fifteen (15) years and whose nominations have been endorsed by a four-fifths majority of the votes cast by those present and entitled to vote at a management committee meeting. Voting at the Annual General Meeting and management committee meeting shall be by secret ballot.
- b)** The member being nominated should have carried out some service as a member of the Club management committee.
- c)** Nominations for Life Membership shall be in writing and signed by the nominees. Two members of the club who have served fifteen (15) years satisfactory service with this club. Nomination to be submitted to a management committee of which fourteen (14) days notice has been given and if so endorsed to be submitted to the next Annual

General Meeting.

- d)** The nominees may speak for the nomination at both the management committee meeting and the Annual General Meeting.

VOTES CAST: 24 votes for amendment

Replace existing Clause 16.

16. NEW MEMBERSHIP NOMINATION

- a)** Applications for membership shall be in writing on the official form of the Club duly signed by the applicant, and his/her proposers, who themselves must be members of at least 12 months standing, together with an application fee equivalent to the annual subscription fee of the class of membership being applied for. This will ensure that each member in training is covered by Personal Accident Insurance. The names of the applicant must be exhibited on the notice board of the Club for a period of not less than twenty-one (21) days, and submitted to the first subsequent management committee meeting for acceptance or otherwise.
- b)** The management committee shall not deal with any application for Active Membership has obtained the Bronze Medallion of the S.L.S.A.
- c)** An applicant shall not be considered by the management committee in the event of he applicant being indebted to another affiliated Surf Life Saving Club.
- d)** In the event of the application for membership not being accepted, the application fee shall be refunded forthwith.
- e)** New members upon being accepted into the Club, may be interviewed by either the executive or the management committee.
- f)** The election of all new members to any category shall be by secret ballot of the management committee at the meeting so convened and approved by no less than three fourths(3/4) of those present and entitled to vote.
- g)** Every new member must have paid the current subscription to the honorary treasurer within fourteen (14) days of notification that the application for membership has been approved by the management committee.
- h)** No person whose nomination for membership has been twice rejected shall be eligible for election as a member or officer of the Club.

16. NEW MEMBERSHIP NOMINATION

Applications for membership shall be in writing on the official form of the Club duly signed by the applicant, together with an application fee equivalent to the annual subscription fee of the class of membership being applied for. This will ensure that each member in training is covered by Personal Accident Insurance

- a) An applicant shall not be considered by the management committee in the event of the applicant being financially indebted to another affiliated Surf Life Saving Club.
- b) In the event of the application for membership not being accepted, the application fee shall be refunded forthwith.
- c) The election of all new members to any category shall be by secret ballot of the management committee at the meeting so convened and approved by no less than three fourths(3/4) of those present and entitled to vote.
- d) No person whose nomination for membership has been twice rejected shall be eligible for election as a member or officer of the Club.

VOTES CAST – UNANIMOUSLY ACCEPTED

The creation of two new membership categories to be inserted into the Constitution between categories Life Membership and Honorary Membership. The numbering of the headings of the clauses following, commencing at Honorary Membership, shall be increased by a value of two i.e. 17. Honorary Membership etc. The new numbering shall be reflected in the Constitution Index.

15. AWARD MEMBERSHIP

- a) Award membership may be granted to a member who holds a SLSA award, one of which must be the Senior First Aid Certificate, or more awards as listed in the SLSA Rules and Regulations.
- b) Such member may be called upon to perform patrols and/or other club obligations within the ability of their qualifications, and undertake the Patrol Induction Program.
- c) Patrolling Award members shall have all the privileges of an Active Member

COMMENTS:

A Cameron: Queries whether the "Award member" would need to do the swim and insurance of member.

VOTES CAST: 24 votes for amendment. 1 vote against.
ADOPTED

16. SOCIAL MEMBERSHIP

- d. Social membership may be granted by the management committee to persons who may or may not be the holder of S.L.S.A. awards.
- e. Social members shall not be called upon to perform active duties.
- f. Social members may use the club premises and facilities as approved by the management committee.
- g. No Social member may vote at any Management Committee or General Meeting unless they have completed a minimum of five (5) years active membership service or hold a management committee position.

COMMENTS:

A Cameron: Stated that it is what a social membership is now.

P Tubby: Requested clarification. N McMaster advised that it was to distinguish between people who only come to be part of the social set rather than contribute to the club as a member.

VOTES CAST: 24 votes accepted amendment
1 vote against

MOTION: All of the proposed changes of the constitution be sent to the Surf Life Saving Central Coast Branch for endorsement or comment. **MOTION CARRIED.**

B Green: Honorary Solicitor is required. J Macfadyen advised that the club had been unable to find one. The club had utilised the services of Peter Reynolds, Taperell Rutledge Solicitors, but there were paid services.

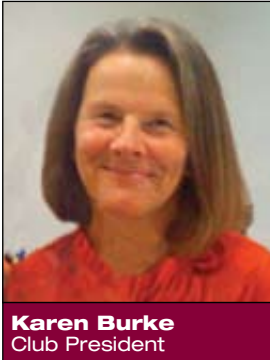

Presidents Report

Killcare SLSC placed second in the ‘Club of the Year’, for the Central Coast Branch of SLS. Fantastic results. I would like to thank the enthusiastic and dedicated committee and club members, that have worked together to make Killcare’s 2009-10 season so productive.

Our first season in the new club building, with its improved and diverse facilities, has both been challenging and rewarding. Administrative and managerial skills are now called upon to best utilize the facilities available to us, whilst meeting the foremost responsibility of Surf Life Saving in the patrol and management of our beach.

This season we enjoyed increased membership, by over 30%, which has also bolstered our patrolling numbers significantly, with an additional 45 Bronze holders and 8 Surf Rescue Certificates gained this season. We started the season with 66 patrolling members and ended with 119.

Our auditorium and bar have enabled the club to improve its fundraising ability with Art Show and hall hire. January saw the inaugural Killcare ‘Art by the Sea’ which was our major fundraiser for the season and the culmination of months of hard work by Luisa and Phillip Scutts, Chris and John Woulfe. The show was an enormous success and exceeded all fundraising expectations. Thank you to Luisa, Phillip, Chris and John for putting together such a professional exhibition, and thank you also to the many club members that gave up their time to assist during the course of the show.

Our new building offers a greater gear storage capacity which has enabled us to increase our stock of much needed, rescue boards, racing mals, nipper boards and racing ski. This as well as our improved training facilities, has had a roll-on effect with participation in competition and club events, for our junior and senior members. We are now enjoying the use of our gym, which will also aid in training our competitors for the coming season as well as being used by the social members of the club.

Killcare Surf Club had the opportunity to host a Masters Carnival, early in the season, which saw a large contingent of Killcare competitors. It was a great day and inspired many to continue in competition throughout the season.

The club was also successful in winning two Central Coast Regional awards for the ‘Keep Australia Beautiful NSW, Clean Beaches’ Competition.

- ‘Sydney Water Conservation Award’ (joint winner with Wamberal Surf Life Saving Club) – for the implementation of 100,000 ltr’s of rainwater storage
- ‘Resource Recovery Award’ - for recycling cooking oil from the Kiosk to be converted to Biodiesel.

Killcare also received the award for runner-up in the state competition for ‘Resource Recovery.’

Thank you to the patrolling members that assisted The Entrance Surf Club patrols during the season. There was a time when Killcare called on the neighboring clubs to bolster our patrols, so we are fortunate to be in a position to return the support shown to us in the past.

Successful competition throughout the year resulted in medals at Branch, State and Australian level. I’d like to recognize and thank John Bourne, the clubs beach coach, for his enthusiasm, dedication and patience, year after year. Congratulations to all the beach competitors, your hard work and success is inspirational, particularly to the younger members of the club. It’s encouraging to see success also in the water events this season.

Thank you to Michael Sheehan. Michael has been tireless in his role as secretary for the



past 3 years, as well as building and business manager, retailing specialist, and the list goes on. Jim Woods has done a fantastic job, taking on Michael's role, mid season, especially when Michael had left such big shoes to fill.

In conclusion, thank you to Gosford City Council for your enormous support to Surf Life Saving on the Central Coast. Also, to all at SLS Central Coast Branch for your guidance,

support and encouragement throughout the season. Finally, thank you again to all in the Killcare SLSC committee for your enthusiasm, dedication and hard work. I'm looking forward to an even stronger season to come.

Treasurer's Report

As the new Treasurer the year started with the opening of the new Clubhouse and a new complex business involving:

- **Surf life savings operations**
- **Management of tenancy (Kiosk and Restaurant)**
- **Functions business for the hall**
- **Trading to Bar**

To start and to cater for these changes we implemented an electronic payment system for all invoices and encouraged the use of our eftpos facility to pay for Membership, clothing and various fund raising activities.

Whilst these changes were necessary to cater for the increase in transactions, they came with their own set of challenges as we needed to capture details of revenue and expenses across all the different entities. This was necessary so that a proper assessment of each operation within the business could be reviewed on a regular basis and improvements made if required.

As a result we decided to use the MYOB accounting software to capture the information and spent some time designing a new "chart of accounts" to ensure meaningful reports could be prepared.

We were fortunate to be assisted in this transition by Simon Prowse of BTP Consulting (Accounting Services) who provided their time and resources free of charge. We have also decided to use a Bookkeeper for a period of time to complete the transition and ensure the process runs smoothly.

The loss of \$41,995 for the year can be mainly attributed to new equipment and supplies that were purchased to stock and furnish to make the Club presentable for our Restaurant and Kiosk tenants, our functions clientele

and of course our Members. The result of this expenditure can be seen in the foyer, bar, hall, gym and the many new items in our store room.

With most of the major expenses incurred and with the accounting and reporting improvements implemented, we expect next year to return to surplus. This surplus is expected to be achieved with all the needs of Members and life saving operations met to the complete satisfaction of all stakeholders. Major items expected to contribute to next years' results are:

- Most new items for the Club have been purchased
- The rent free and rent reduced period for the Kiosk and Restaurant will have a lesser impact this year
- The functions business which broke even in its first year, is expected to be profitable now that it is up and running and is gaining an excellent reputation.
- The bar is becoming more popular with Members and guests
- Membership should continue to increase

Junior Activities Co-Ordinator's Report

What a fantastic season! I have thoroughly enjoyed my first season as Junior Activities Co-Coordinator. It has been a very rewarding season and the Nippers seemed to also enjoy themselves.

Membership

We ended the year with 168 Nippers; this has been a phenomenal increase of 41%.

Raising of the Flags

For the first year ever, Killcare hosted the Raising of the Flags, which signifies the start of the patrol season. This event is part of the Rookie program and is a formal morning with both Mayors from Gosford and Wyong Councils attending to acknowledge the great work volunteer lifesavers do in the summer.

Sponsor – GENESYS Wealth Advisors

Hans Egger is a parent of Nippers and his company has kindly been our sponsor for the past couple of years. He provided the pontoon and the Nipper Bags. He also sponsored the V-Team SMS, an email communication. This was quite useful when the Tsunami warning needed to be broadcast. The V-Team was organized by David Abrahams. At the carnivals, Hans would also take the GENESYS sun shelter for the Nippers to provide shade.

Boards

The Club purchased a few competition boards in addition to the Woolworths Fresh Food Kids Community Grant. We received \$1,000 from this grant. With this money we purchased three soft foam competition boards used for the 9 & 10 year olds.

Board Training

Thanks to Jim Willis for running the Board Training each Thursday afternoon. Thank you to Nic Urie, who along with myself, and a few other parents, provided water safety at training. Board and Ski Captain's Report

The Club purchased two surf skis for the first time in over fifteen years and a total of fifteen Nipper boards and adult racing Malibu's. The Club also acquired some Nipper competition boards with a grant we received.

The Club has just received a new racing Malibu for our second place in the Club of the Year awards on the Central Coast. We have plenty of training boards as well as a training ski with adjustable foot pedals and we encourage Members to take advantage of this great equipment next season. Younger Members need to be supervised when using the equipment outside of Club supervised activities and surf skis will suit most Members from around 16 years of age. The Club has a number of competition boards that are locked up to ensure they are in great condition for competitions and for those Members that need to practice for surf life saving competition.

The training boards and skis are for Member use and it is for security reasons that access to this equipment is restricted at times. If anyone is keen to compete next season, or just improve their board or ski skills, please approach the board and ski officer or any member of the committee to try and organise suitable access and supervision of themselves and the equipment. If using the equipment whilst on the beach of a weekend, let the patrol captain know you are in the water.

Thank you to all those Members, and in particular the Patrol Captains, that helped keep an eye on the boards and skis this season, encouraging all people that used the equipment to wash it down before storing and assisted with storage of these fragile and expensive items on the racks. I am happy to report that we didn't lose a board or ski this season (or a Club member!) although we had lots of dings and cracks that kept the Club's board repairers very busy.

Thank you also to Bryce Cameron and Mark Krebs for their work in maintaining the ski fleet, Peter Ardil for his technical support and Patrol 8 and my family for allowing me to spend some quality time in the shed maintaining the boards. Nic Urie was instrumental in the design and implementation of the board security system and Jonathan and Karen Burke with the board and ski portable and fixed storage system. Yvonne Hayter and husband Steve 'trained' the Nippers and Rookies in looking after the equipment and with others, including Dave Sneddon, in identifying dings and cracks so we could keep on top of repairs and maintenance.

I would encourage Members and younger member's parents and siblings to ensure anyone using a board or ski on the beach, return it rinsed off to a rack in the storage shed. I look forward to seeing lots of equipment out next season being used by a variety of Members.

Although we had a frightful run of serious injuries, we managed to field teams in Open and Masters Carnivals at local, Sydney, State & Australian Championships.

The Nipper contingent grew enormously over the season and the largest team of nippers ever, represented Killcare this year at local Carnivals, and also at Branch Championships with competitors showing they can perform against other Clubs at a high level. Highlight of this carnival must be Ruby Cooper winning our first Gold medal (U-8 years Beach Sprint) at Branch for quite a few years. Ruby also finished 2nd in the Wade Race. The Branch Championships in Opens and Masters proved most successful. Hugely pleasing was to see us feature in water events with Bryce Cameron gaining two seconds in the Surf and Tube race, while Jake McCarthy finished 3rd in the U-15 Surf race. Blake Donkin made the final of the U-15 Board race.

Our beach team had a field day in the Master's events with Joel Maybury winning the Sprint, Flags & Relay, Phil & Colin Tubby also placed in Sprints and Flags. Our women competitors medaled in the Relay and Sprints.

State Championships at Swansea Belmont proved to be costly for our Masters team. DQ in both Men's and Women's Beach Relay, with both teams certain of a Silver medal (maybe Gold). Bryce Cameron won a Bronze medal in the Surf race and 4th in the Tube; Joel Maybury won Silver in the Sprint and Flags; Leah Fotofili, Laura Washington & Phil Tubby made finals along with our relay Teams.

Gear and Radio Steward's Report

It's been an interesting time to be involved in the Club as we move into the new spacious Club house and tackle the organisation of the gear area.

Equipment

Essential equipment for patrols was upgraded before the start of the season. This included new beach signs, patrol area flags, rescue tubes and fins. The addition of a second First Aid Kit equipped with Oxy Resuscitation and Suction meant that roving patrols in the ATV and the patrol tent would be able to respond quickly to an emergency on the beach.

Storage

The new gear bay is more than twice as big as the previous Club house but still seems to become cramped and disorganized. By the end of the season new storage systems had improved this, including:

4 new mobile storage racks for the foam and fiberglass nippers boards, racing mals and rescue boards resulted in easier access for participants to borrow boards, improved security and better care of the equipment

A wall mounted rack for racing skis and possibly another one on the way.

Industrial shelving for all the other odds and ends, such as outboard engine parts and nippers equipment

With an improved IRB storage planned over winter, we should see this area working well by next season.

Radios

The existing fleet of 7 radios has survived another season with no losses though some are ready for retirement and replacement. Killcare also received a 2nd waterproof communication helmet as a prize earlier in the season, giving the Club the capacity to equip both the IRB and Jet ski drivers with the necessary radio support whilst out on the water.

Grant Submissions

The Club has also been busy applying for a number of grants through Sport and Recreation, NSW Volunteers, Emergency Services, Woolworths and Telstra for replacement radios, resuscitation training equipment and new patrol tents. The success of these applications should be announced in the next 2 months, ready for the start of the next season.
