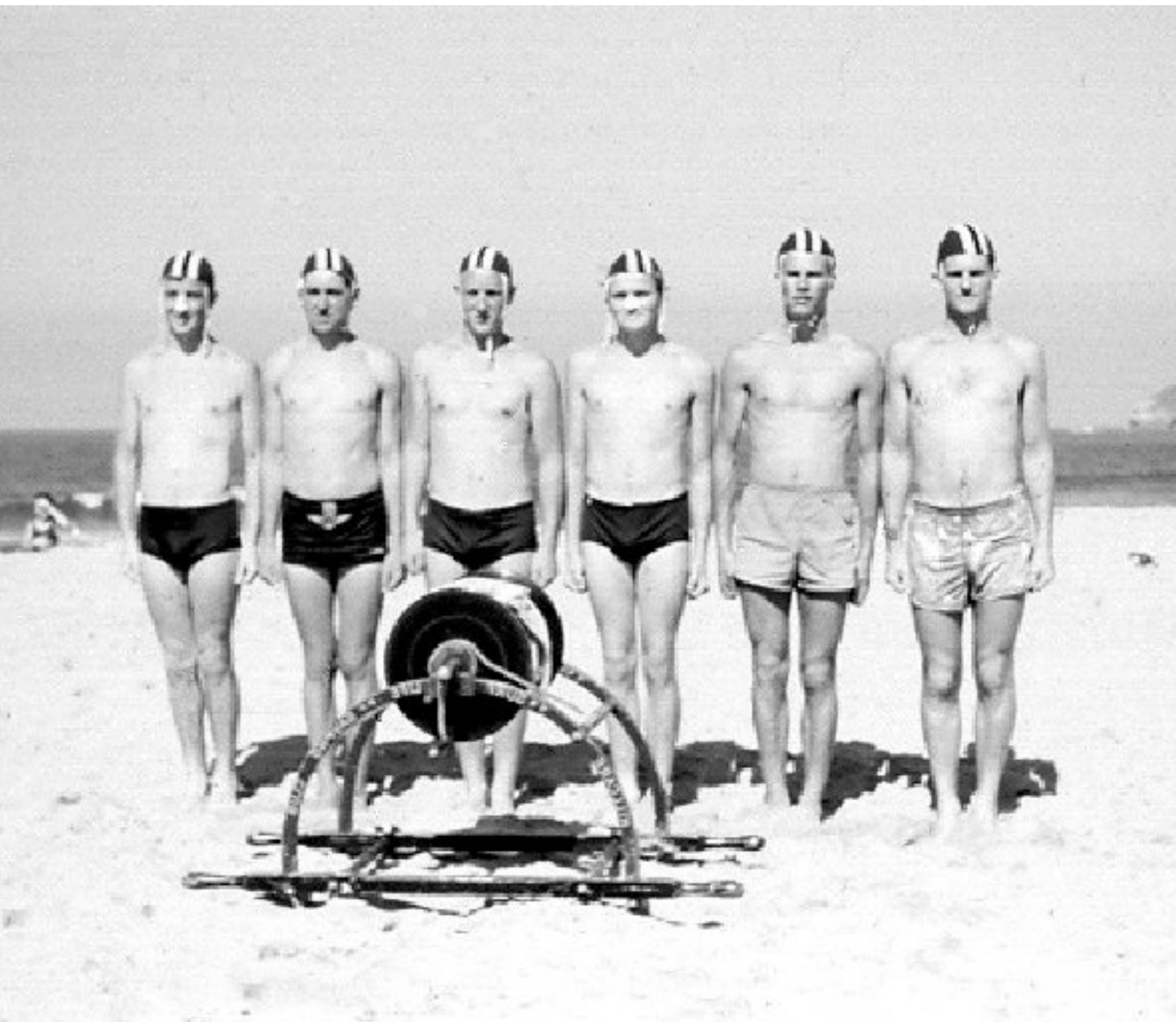

Good Friday, April 19, marked the last scheduled patrol for Patrol 9 for the 2018/19 season, and it was the day that John Bourne - Life Member, Club Patron, World Championship Coach, Surf Life Saving Hall of Fame Inductee and Active Patrol Member - decided he would take up a privilege he was eligible for about 48 seasons ago; retiring from rostered patrols to move to Active Reserve.

During the winter season of 1958 a strong Rugby League team from Newtown came up to Gosford to play a trial Rugby League game against 'Gosford Townies', the local league champions.

A few of the Newtown team came from Erskineville and stayed at a place at Killcare owned by the Tubby's. They all had a great weekend and decided when the summer came, they'd join the local Surf Club.

Killcare was very lean in numbers that year, and the small influx was a great help to the patrolling numbers as well as Surf Carnivals. But it was a commitment - it meant coming up to Killy every weekend to gain their bronze and in those days it was two and a half hour steam train from Central to Woy Woy, then a Ferry to Killcare, albeit with a stop at the pub on the way.

The first 6 gained their bronze in early 1959, including Phil Tubby snr, Rod Roberts, Roger Gurr, Bill Maxwell, Dennis Shoesmith & John Bourne.



So began not just John's involvement with Killcare SLSC but something of a dynasty with the whole Bourne family giving distinguished service with the Club.

It's almost impossible to overstate JB's contribution to the Club over the last 60 years. He's not just writ large in the history of Killcare, he has become part of the DNA and his influence will be felt for decades to come.

The lead up to Good Friday featured saw a crowd of appreciative clubbies and community members line the path up from the beach cheering John off the beach when he signed off on his last regular patrol.

Congratulations JB, thanks for everything you've done and continue to do for Killcare SLSC.

Craig has had a succession plan over the past 3 years and we are starting to see the benefits with the retention rate from nippers through to bronze increasing. Sunday nippers again this season was well attended with mother nature being a lot kinder to us this season allowing for more water activities. Through the work of Craig and with the assistance of Scott Leivesley we also had an increase of nippers competing at branch and state carnivals with some very pleasing results. With the assistance of club coach John Bourne the future is looking good for our young athletes. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Bryce Cameron for running board training on a weekday afternoon helping members increase their board skills.

Scott Vernon once again did a tremendous job in keeping patrols on the beach this season. I believe this is one of the hardest positions to fill in the club and Scott has done a tremendous job over the past two seasons under very difficult circumstances. Scott has indicated he won't be running for re election next season and he will be sorely missed but I wish him all the best and make sure you don't make a stranger of yourself.

During the 2018 – 2019 the Committee and our Administration Officer have been very active in securing grants through several branches of Government and SLS levels to purchase much needed equipment and supplies to help with our core operations. There was a downturn in hires from the Function room early in the 2018/19 season and this is reflected in the accounts. However due to the continued work of the administration currently we are holding deposits of approximately \$5,000 for future bookings. One patient left in an ambulance the other was airlifted out. Feedback from the Care Flight crew was fantastic and commended everyone involved, including our Rookies who help in organising and marshalling the landing area.

Thank you to our fantastic training team who have provided 19 new Bronzies with the skills to pass their assessments and join a patrol. There is plenty more 'on the job' experience to be gained but we are all extremely thankful for the extra patrolling members.

Plenty has already been written and said about John Bourne but it would be remiss not to add my thanks in this report. JB is hanging up his red and yellow uniform after patrolling for 60 years. That's an incredible amount of community service. He'll still be seen around the club, coaching our youngsters and hoping to snag another Aussie title. Thanks JB, for everything you have done and continue to do for our little club. Legend is an accolade that is used too frequently these days, but in your case it is absolutely fitting.

Our end of season celebration was a site to behold; it was a fitting way to see out the last afternoon of the year. The season past 2018 / 2019 was a real mixture in club and carnival events, we had some really great results and some very poor performances.

If we go back over past years, this is nothing new for our club and it seems at the end of each decade we seem to be at the bottom of the valley, then we pick up and reach great peaks.

I do feel we are on track to lift our game and with a stream excellent Nippers and Rookies coming through the ranks, plus interest in Masters events especially women's beach and male boats to assist our existing teams I am most confident of a successful season.

A shining light of our season must be the selection of three competitors from our club into the Central Coast Branch team. This equals our best ever effort of the 2001/2002 & 2003 years when the branch finally decided to select our top Beach Sprinters, in doing so won the NSW Inter Branch Championships.

Selected was Luke Hayter, Natasha Marteene and Lilly Hofer. All three competed exceptionally well at the two-day Carnival at Blackhead Beach Mid North Coast. Congratulations to these three great Killcare Lifesavers.

Also just to mention these competitors all won their respective events at this year's branch Championships.

At this year's branch championships 5 gold medals were won, all in beach events. It would be wonderful to try and widen this gap to include other events especially water events and maybe an R & R team, March Past Team, these events do require a training program to succeed.

Gold Medal Winners at branch included Ross Keena, Luke Hayter, Natasha Marteene & Katie Shoesmith also Mitch Hayter, Matt Hayter & Raf Lagos picked up minor medals.

At this year's State titles held at Swansea Belmont we produced some really good results, Luke Hayter won two silver medals in the Beach Sprint and Beach flag in aged events, also Katie Shoesmith won a bronze medal in the women's beach flags. These medals were the first we have won at State Titles for a few years.

Also at State the Men's open Beach Relay team made the Final and Natasha Marteene finished 5th in her semi-final beach sprint, very good efforts.

The gym has been well attended and equipment is all in good shape. We will be starting organised preseason training e.g. Sandhill's, soft sand, power workouts and plyometric late July this year as the pre selection carnivals are to be held in October for the Inter- Branch Team.

Another fantastic season of Killcare Nippers has come to a close and with it a marked progression in our core aim of training future lifesavers. The primary aims of Nippers are about learning new skills that can save your own or someone else's life. It's about gaining confidence in your own abilities and stretching them. It's about facing fears and pushing past them. All while making friends, working as a team and absolutely above all having fun. If you did any or all of those, you won Nippers.

That said, we without doubt punched well above our weight in our carnival performances this season and the spirit with which the kids participated in the Club Champs was great to see. But above all the heart of the group and willingness to face their fears and overcome them while recognising their limits has been, as always, an absolute joy to see.

I get the joy of the admin and the honour of putting my name to the Nippers program, however the group of people I get to work with are the heart and soul of Nippers.

To all the Age Managers, thank you once again from the bottom of all our hearts. Without the Age Managers fronting every Sunday, leading their groups with such enthusiasm, the program wouldn't exist. Particular mention goes to Chris Scarlett who ended his run with his U14 group that he's guided since they were U6's.

Too many people to mention took to the water to ensure the Nippers are safe in boards and swims however I'd particularly like to mention our Killy Krakens, the recent graduates of the Rookie program, who, coordinated by Tom Buckley, did for today's Nippers what qualified lifesavers did for them not so long ago; provided encouragement and ensured safety and confidence as they rounded the cans.

It's always hard to single out people for their contribution but a few deserve special mention; our Club Coach John 'JB' Bourne lent his endless expertise to anyone willing to pay attention and this was reflected in our carnival results. Bryce Cameron, ably assisted by some of the Krakens, took board training a couple of times a week and, while a few tried their skills at competition, board skills are a vital part of lifesaving which will stand them in good stead as they progress to SRC and beyond. Scott Leivesley took on the role of Carnival Team Manager, first to arrive and last to leave and getting us a prime position to fly the Killcare flag. He's also driven participation to new highs which brings its own challenges. It would be remiss not to mention the Board and Committee as a whole who are as always incredibly supportive of all that we do at the Junior end, but particular thanks goes to our outgoing DLS Scott Vernon who has gone out of his way to clear the path of obstacles and lend his considerable expertise to the education of the Nippers. Last but by no means least, thanks to everyone who's been on patrol on any Sunday morning. We know the imposition the water activities create when you have a beach to look after but you've all been unfailingly helpful and supportive.

A particular highlight of the season was on the back of some unpleasantness when, just as we were sending the Nippers down to the beach word came up that there was a serious spinal incident in progress. Duty Officer Dave Sneddon was quickly on the scene and with road ambulances delayed the CareFlight chopper was dispatched. The logistics of landing a chopper in the car park on a beautiful Sunday morning is no small feat and Dave quickly gathered the Rookies to help with traffic management. The way they calmly and efficiently did what needed to be done highlighted why we all do what we do - training future lifesavers. They played a real and invaluable part in evacuating a seriously injured patient who, while facing a long and hard recovery, will walk out of hospital. Their involvement was specifically recognised by the Patrol, Branch and the CareFlight team.

As mentioned our carnival participation this season has been fantastic. It's as much about the participation as the results and the sportsmanship shown by all our competitors is always commented on. A few of our Nippers had stand-out performances particularly the U/11 males and females who swept all before them in their individual and mixed relays throughout the season. Congratulations must also go to Lilly Hofer on her achievement of not just making the Central Coast team but on excellent performances at the inter-branch champs.

We started our competitive season at Umina in November with bronze to Lilly Hofer in the flags, 1st and 2nd in the flags to Alex McCoombe-Lopez and Vic Horton, and Alex also getting 2nd in his sprint, and Lilly taking gold in her sprint. In the team events, the U/11 boys team of Alex, Vic, Martin Macdonald and Sascha Ryall stormed home with the gold medal while the girls team of Lexi, Liv, CC Bradley and Arabella Robb picked up 2nd place.

Our next hit out at Terrigal in December included bronze to Lexi in the flags and CC in the sprint. In a stunning finish in the boys flags we scored 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th from Alex, Zane Foulis, Vic and Martin. Oscar McCoombe-Lopez made his presence felt with a 1st in the flags and 2nd in the sprint. The boys relay continued their dominance with another gold Alex, Vic, Zane and Martin with the girls unfortunately DQ'd on a baton change. Our mixed relays teams picked up 1st and 4th

In January it was up to Toowoong Bay where Lexi got bronze in the flags, CC 2nd in her sprint, Alex and Martin achieved 1st and 3rd respectively in their sprints while Lilly picked up 2nd in the flags and gold in the sprint. The U/13 girls put the band back together with Lilly, Lily Woods, Lauren Sinclair and supersub Molly Vernon getting silver. Alex, Vic and Zane picked up 1st, 2nd and 3rd in their flags and then teamed up with Martin to once again get gold in their relay. Another stunner saw our 2 U/11 mixed relay teams cross the line 1st and 2nd.

It was almost a copy and paste at the Branch Champs at Soldiers in February with Lilly 1st in the sprint and 2nd in the flags, the U13 girls relay 2nd, Oscar 3rd in the flags, Alex and Zane 1st and 3rd in their flags and Alex 1st in his sprint. The boys suffered a dropped baton but still managed 2nd in their relay while the girls, with JB's guidance on the changes, came 2nd also. And it was another 1-2 finish for the mixed relay teams.

We took a team of 11 to the State Titles at Swansea Belmont in March with the U11 girls - Liv, CC, Arabella and Lexi - the U11 boys - Zane, Alex, Martin and Vic, plus Niamh Macdonald representing the U9's and Oscar and Lilly rounding out the team. They all represented the Club with pride and honour and we featured in a bunch of finals which for a small team is no small achievement. The best result was Lexi's 4th in flags.

Our presentation day is always a highlight of the season, recognising as it does not just the athletic achievements of the season just gone, but through the Age Managers Awards the more intangible aspects - spirit, enthusiasm and effort. Congratulations to all award recipients and a particular congratulations to our JM MacFadyen Rookie of the Year, Makayla Redman.

Thanks once again to everyone involved in the Nippers program, it's something I believe passionately in as it provides not only a pathway through the lifesaving movement, but lifelong friendships and invaluable skills whether you put them to use 'under the tent' or not. Surf Lifesaving at Branch, State and National levels also provide many leadership development opportunities that once again, whether you apply them to your Club or take them out into the wider world, can only enrich your life.

A special thanks to my family; time on the beach, officiating and in meetings takes away from time with you, but thanks for sharing my passion for the program.

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 2009, the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and associated regulations. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

Killcare Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is an association registered under the Associations Incorporations Act 2009 and domiciled in New South Wales.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis.

Depreciation

All fixed assets, excluding freehold land, are depreciated on a straight line or a diminishing value basis over their useful lives of the business.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the incorporated association and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Sale of Goods

Sale of goods revenue is recognised at the point of sale, which is where the customer has taken delivery of the goods, the risks and rewards are transferred to the customer and there is a valid sales contract.
